DAUGHTERS have been adopted by Vinod Desai: Renuka (*1999), Nikita (*2001), Neha (*2003), Rai (*2004), Poonam (*2005) and Shubhangi (*2011).

An estimated 19 MILLION street children live in India - from a total population of 1,33 billion people.
